Dear Parents of HVCS,

With the exception of some higher levels of illness these first few weeks of school, we have had an outstanding start to this 2023-2024 school year. I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you and your

students for your collaboration in helping to make the start of this year a great success for all.

One of our primary goals this year is to really help our students live a life of virtue, calling them on to a greater life of holiness. We couldn't do this without you and all that you provide your children at home in this realm. When you show your students a love of living out a virtuous life, you provide a unique opportunity for them to follow in your footsteps. 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It has been 11 years since the HVCS community prayed with and mourned Bridget Therese Smith, lovingly called Bridget the Brave by her friends and classmates. Bridget passed away after a 3-year battle with a brain tumor at the age of 12 on Oct 5, 2012. Along the way, Bridget experienced many healings and was spared an earlier death. She was a model of grace, peace, humor, holiness and taking "Every Day With Joy" to her peers and all who knew her.

After her passing, her parish and family immediately began to hear stories of miracles, favors and conversions attributed to her prayers. Her pastor, Fr. John Riccardo, during his funeral homily, said "I have never said this publicly before, but I believe we are at the funeral of a saint." Five years ago, he submitted numerous testimonies of her heroic virtue to Archbishop Vigneron written by family, friends, teachers, and others to encourage the opening of a cause for sainthood. The Archbishop encouragingly asked that a book of her virtues be professionally written.

"Zebra Day" will be on Friday, October 6th.

It is a day we honor the memory of Bridget Therese Smith, a former student of HVCS and sister of current student, Mary Smith (8th Grade). Bridget loved zebras and the color pink, and our HVCS family wears these colors on her special day. Her family motto, "every day with joy" brings grace and peace to us! Donations to the Bridget Smith Memorial Fund will be accepted and awarded to families in unexpected and urgent need.
